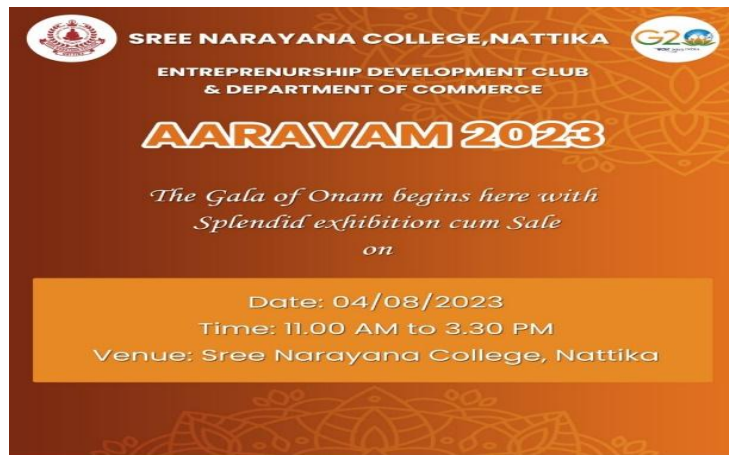


ONAM EXHIBITION- AARAVAM 2023 (04-08-2023)

As part of the wild life week 2023, the final year B.Sc students of the Post Graduate Department of Zoology, Sree Narayana College, Nattika organized a nature walk to the Chimmony Wildlife Sanctuary on 7th October 2023. 37 students along with 2 staff (Dr. Remya V.K, Head of the Department and Dr. Simi.S, Assistant Professor) went to the sanctuary. It was arranged through the Social Forestry Department of Kerala. Sri. Pramod, Forest Officer, Chimmony Wildlife Sanctuary guided us throughout the event. He deeply explained the hidden beauty of forests and the behavioral aspects of the wild animals. On the way we spotted many animals like wild squirrel, viper, poisonous spider, bison and elephants. Students really enjoyed this real forest experience. In the afternoon a lecture session was arranged by the forest office which was lead by Sri. Rajesh, the Forest Office Assistant. He explained the conflicts between humans and wildlife and shared his experience during a forest fire which was really embarrassing. After the visit, we explored the "kottavanchi" journey through the chimmony dam site, which is really a biodiversity spot. By 5.00pm we returned to college.

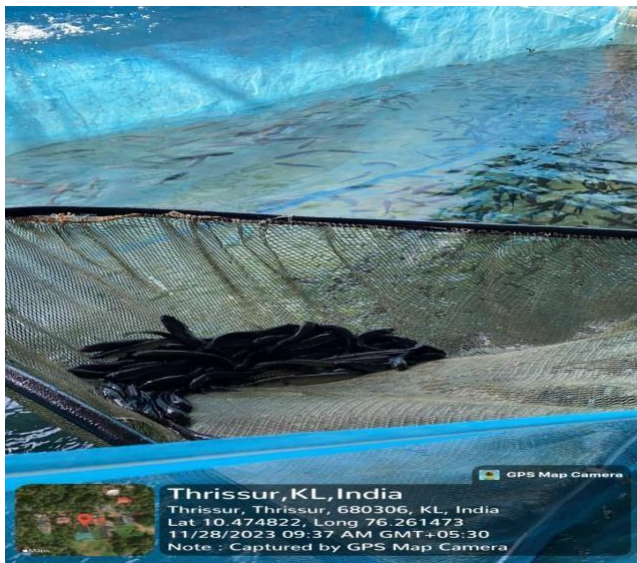
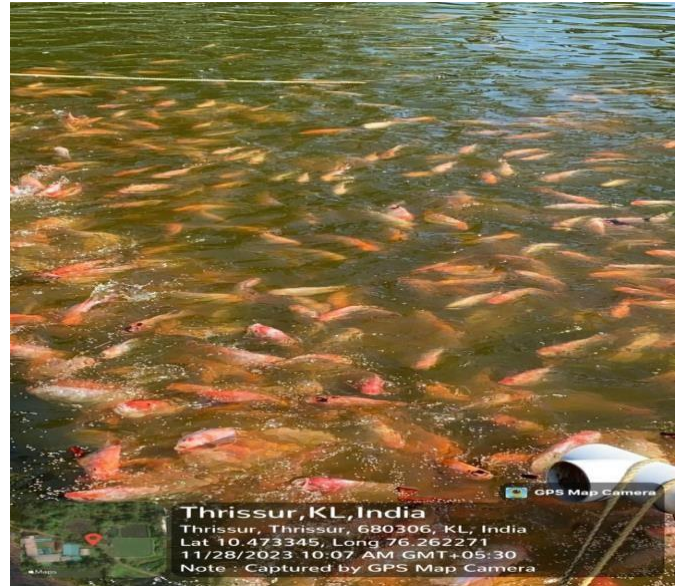
Chimminy wildlife sanctuary is a protected area located along the Western Ghats in Chalakkudy taluk of Thrissur district, Kerala. Established in the year 1984, the sanctuary with an area of about 85.067km² is on the western slopes of the Nelliampathy hills. The highest peak in sanctuary is Punda peak. Along with the neighboring Peechi-Vazhani wildlife sanctuaries, it forms a continuous protected area of 210km². It also lies just West of Parambikulam wildlife sanctuary, providing some habitat connectivity with the forests of that relatively large protected area. The sanctuary consists of the watershed areas of the Kurumali river and the Mupliam River. The headquarters of the sanctuary is at Echippara which is 40km away from the city of Thrissur.



FISHERIES INSTITUTE

Post Graduate Department of Zoology had arranged a half day Field visit for second year post Graduate students to Rosen Fisheries Institute at Marathakkara, Thrissur on 28 Nov 2023. Rosen Fisheries has been in the field of Aquaculture since last 40 years. The Managing Partner, of Rosen Fisheries C.D. Sebastian is a Post Graduate in Fisheries. They have a group of supporting scientists, technicians and management experts. They have our own Hatchery, nursery, grow out systems, feed production system, laboratory facility, training facility with library etc. They are one of the major suppliers of Fish & Prawn seed and feed to private farmers, various government agencies, research station & Universities etc. since last 40 years. We provide consultancy service for shrimp & Fish culture and Hatchery throughout India. It is the first commercial scampi hatchery in India, started in 1987 with aid of Marine Products Export Development Authority of India. They are the first to produce organic scampi PL and participated in Indian organic aquaculture program initiated by MPEDA.

We had a detailed class on induced breeding by Mr C D Sebastian. Induced breeding is a technique where organism is stimulated by particular hormone or other synthetic hormone or by providing condition, introduced to breed in captive condition. The need for induced breeding is because of environmental conditions like photoperiod, rain, temperature, currents of water and insufficient release of hormone, deficient of natural food in captive condition. Induced breeding is practiced in a wide variety of species such as carps, catfishes, clarias, mullets, Tilapia etc.. They provided services such as pond based aquaculture system, flow through system, biofloc aquaculture system, recirculation aquaculture system, aquaponics. It provides us with an inspiring experience regarding the application of fisheries.

INTERNATIONAL WOMENS DAY CELEBRATION – A TALK ON WOMEN SAFETY AND LAW AND SIGNING OF AN MOU WITH STREECHETHANA,KOZHIKODE ON 26/03/2024

Sree Narayana College and Sthreechethana,Kozhikode , an NGO committed to empowering women, grooming children and upliftment of society at large – decided to unite to carry out programs for promoting education, skill development, mental and physical health, and addressing various issues for women. A MOU was signed in the programme. Key note address was initiated by Adv Jisha Pallikkara . The talk was on Laws related to women and safety.

The talk highlighted Women's safety is a critical concern in India, with rising incidents of gender-based violence. An overview of the legal framework protecting women's rights in India was highlighted and discussed the challenges and solutions to ensuring women's safety. And also discussed Indian Penal Code (IPC): Sections 354 (assault or criminal force against a woman), 376 (rape), and 498A (husband or relative of husband of a woman subjecting her to cruelty), Protection of Women from Domestic Violence Act (2005) which Provides legal recourse for victims of domestic violence, Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition, and Redressal) Act (2013) which addresses workplace harassment

Beat Plastic Pollution

As part of the ongoing Fruit Tree Campaign (initiated in June 2020), the department distributed and monitored fruit trees across the campus, with regular maintenance overseen by students and staff. On June 5th, the college was officially declared a “Zero Waste Campus,” underlining its commitment to minimizing waste and promoting sustainable practices. Additionally, endemic plants were distributed to the college's National Service Scheme (NSS) units, encouraging conservation of native species while involving students in plant maintenance.
